

FINANCIAL JEOPARDY!

We typically customize this game to the audience we teach so below are some options for ways to play the game.

You will need: A jeopardy board. We have created one in PowerPoint for you. You can access this also via Google Slides if you have a Gmail account.

Below are a list of questions and commonly used terms for your review before playing the game.

A PowerPoint template has been created for you here (link).

If you do not have access to PowerPoint, you can create your own board at home.

Timed questions:

You can also swap the questions and answers if you have young children. Answer the question yourself, and let your child provide the question.

Rules of Financial Jeopardy:

Give your child/children the questions in advance so they can learn the answers. Each child gets a 'pot' to hold their winnings. You can use monopoly money or work with your child to make the fake money in a quick arts and crafts lesson.

Play individually or in groups.

Display the questions on the PowerPoint screen provided or on the one you created.

The first child to go picks a category and a point value.

You read the answer

Give the children a set time to answer the question. The child who raises their hand first gives the answer in the form of a question. Play the Jeopardy tune while you wait for the child to answer.

If the student or team is correct, they are awarded the point value of the question.

Keep a track of each child's answers. Work with the child to add the points into the 'pot'

The dollar values disappear after each question.

Move on to the next question.

The child/children with the most points wins.
